

There are many factors to consider when choosing the region for your graduate school. Some of these factors are mentioned here:



02 Estimated cost of living

Financing options available, scholarships, financial assistance etc.

104 Employment opportunities

Post graduation plan and opportunities

Step 4: Find the right universities

BE REALISTIC. Apply to programs that offer you a reasonable chance of acceptance; apply to as many programs as you can, and include programs that you would attend if your first few choices result in rejections. You should also consider the following factors when selecting graduate school and programs:

Reputation and ranking of the school.

Cost of the program, and the availability of assistance.

The programs offered and the nature of the program requirements.



Research and support facilities.

Geographic location of the campus.

Step 5: Shortlisting process

Once you have started your research maintain a log similar to the one shown on the right so that your process can be systematic and it is easier for you to compare different schools later on. The template shown on the right is customizable and therefore, you are encouraged to add more fields if you would like.

Step 6: Standardized Tests

These are the most commonly taken tests for graduate school admission. Every program and school have a different requirement so make sure to check the requirements thoroughly before deciding to appear for any test(s).

GRE - Graduate Record Exam

- Admission standardized test
- Validity 5 years
- 3 Sections: Quantitative reasoning, verbal reasoning and analytical writing
- Ideal Score: 320 and above



GMAT - Graduate Management Assessment Test

- Admission standardized test
 Validity 5 years
- 4 Sections: Quantitative reasoning, verbal reasoning, analytical writing and integrated reasoning
- Ideal Score: 580 and above








Step 7: Gather all the documents
