



ROBOTICS

Robotics: Fundamental Concepts and Analysis is designed to fully meet the requirements of undergraduate students of mechanical engineering for a course in robotics. With the inclusion of some key advanced topics, the book also serves as an introductory text for postgraduate students specializing in robotics.

The book introduces the science and engineering of robotics and provides in-depth coverage of mechanical manipulation. It emphasizes the fundamental mathematical concepts and analytical tools required for a topic, develops the relevant theory and algorithms, and then illustrates the theory with the help of worked-out examples. The book presents all key areas of kinematics, dynamics, and control of manipulators in a single text and treats the kinematics and dynamics of serial and parallel manipulators in a unified way.

Newer robotic architectures such as parallel manipulators, flexible manipulators, and mobile robots have also been discussed at length. The book also uses computational software MATLAB and MAPLE for problem solving. Written in a comprehensive and concise manner, the text is student friendly and includes several examples and exercise problems.

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

HOW TO CITE PARAPHRASED TEXT OR IDEA?



In-text citation

APA In-text Paraphrase When the solution had been sitting for a number of months, the employees tested for bacteria (Murphy, 1998).

MLA In-text Paraphrase Delayed, uncontrolled repetitive appearance of hallucinations and other intrusive phenomena (Murphy 11).

HOW TO CITE SHORT QUOTATIONS?



In-text citation

APA In-text Direct quote A traumatic response frequently entails a "delayed, uncontrolled repetitive appearance of hallucinations and other intrusive phenomena" (Murphy, 1996, p. 11).

MLA In-text Direct quote **Murphy** explains that delayed, uncontrolled repetitive appearance of hallucinations and other intrusive phenomena(11).

HOW TO CITE LONG QUOTATIONS?

MORE THAN 40 WORDS

IN-TEXT CITATION APA

Long quotation

Jones's (1998) study found the following:

Students often had difficulty using APA style, especially when it was their first time citing sources. This difficulty could be attributed to the fact that many students failed to purchase a style manual or to ask their teacher for help. (p. 199)






Nelly Dean treats Heathcliff poorly and dehumanizes him throughout her narration:

MLA – PAGE FORMATTING GUIDELINES

- Type your paper on a computer and print it out on standard, white 8.5 x 11-inch paper.
- Double-space the text of your paper and use a legible font (e.g. Times New Roman).
- Whatever font you choose, MLA recommends that the regular and italics type styles contrast enough that they are each distinct from one another. The font size should be 12 pt.
- Leave only one space after periods or other punctuation marks (unless otherwise prompted by your instructor).
- Set the margins of your document to 1 inch on all sides.
- Indent the first line of each paragraph one half-inch from the left margin. MLA recommends that you use the "Tab" key as opposed to pushing the space bar five times.
- Create a header that numbers all pages consecutively in the upper right-hand corner, one-half inch from the top and flush with the right margin. (Note: Your instructor may ask that you omit the number on your first page. Always follow your instructor's guidelines.)
 - If you have any endnotes, include them on a separate page before your Works Cited page. Entitle the section Notes (centered, unformatted).

If Numbered (all flush left with no underlining, bold, or italics): Example:

- 1. Soil Conservation
- 1.1 Erosion
- 1.2 Terracing
- 2. Water Conservation
- 3. Energy Conservation

If Unnumbered (by level):

Example: Level 1: bold, flush left Level 2: italics, flush left Level 3: centered, bold Level 4: centered, italics Level 5: underlined, flush left

APA – PAGE FORMATTING GUIDELINES

- Your essay should be typed and double-spaced on standard-sized paper (8.5" x 11"), with 1" margins on all sides.
- Include a **page header** (also known as the "**running head**") at the top of every page.
- The **running head** is a shortened version of your paper's title and cannot exceed 50 characters including spacing and punctuation.
- Insert page numbers flush right
- **Main Headings** should be bold and centered and then sub headings should start from the left margin (bold). Further sub headings should be indented with first line of the paragraph.

APA uses a system of five heading levels

APA Headings	
Level	Format
1	Centered, Boldfaced, Upper & Lowercase Headings
2	Left-aligned, Boldface, Upper & Lowercase Headings
3	Indented, boldface, lowercase heading with a period.
4	Indented, boldface, italicized, lowercase heading with period.
5	Indented, italicized, lowercase heading with a period.

WORKS CITED PAGE IN MLA - GUIDELINES

- Begin your Works Cited page on a separate page at the end of your research paper. It should have the same one-inch
 margins and last name, page number header as the rest of your paper.
- Label the page Works Cited (do not italicize the words Works Cited or put them in quotation marks) and center the words Works Cited at the top of the page.
- Only the title should be centered. The citation entries themselves should be aligned with the left margin.
- Double space all citations, but do not skip spaces between entries.
- Indent the second and subsequent lines of citations by 0.5 inches to create a hanging indent.
- List page numbers of sources efficiently, when needed. If you refer to a journal article that appeared on pages 225 through 250, list the page numbers on your Works Cited page as pp. 225-250. If the excerpt is spans multiple pages, use "pp." Note that MLA style uses a hyphen in a span of pages.
- If only one page of a print source is used, mark it with the abbreviation "p." before the page number (e.g., p.157). If a span of pages is used, mark it with the abbreviation "pp." before the page number (e.g., pp.157-168).

REFERENCE LIST

- Place the list of references cited at the end of the paper
- Start references on a new page with References heading centralized
- Begin each entry with the left margin
- Indent subsequent lines five to seven spaces (hanging indent)
- Double space between entries
- *Italicize* the title of books, journals, magazines, etc.
- Arrange sources alphabetically beginning with author's last name
- If author has more than one source, arrange entries by year, earliest first
- Capitalize all major words in **journal** titles. When referring to the titles of **books**, **chapters**, **articles**, **or webpages**, capitalize only the first letter of the first word of a title and subtitle, the first word after a colon or a dash in the title, and proper nouns
